

Contraceptive Technologies: Expand access to safe and effective contraceptive technologies.

- Lead coalition of reproductive health, rights and justice organizations to secure evidence-based labeling on morning-after pills.
- Evaluate safety, efficacy and market potential for a daily over-the-counter birth control pill.
- Investigate and correct myths and misinformation about FDA approved methods of birth control.

Abortion Technologies: Regain political momentum for funding and coverage of abortion care by growing and mobilizing a new segment of activists.

- Develop research-based communication strategies for new audiences.
- Increase political will to respect and support a woman's decision-making in pregnancy.

Health and Wellness: Secure federal chemical policy reform that protects women's reproductive health and fertility from toxic chemicals.

- Strengthen regulation of toxic chemicals to improve reproductive health outcomes.
